Book review of HUMANITY'S LAST STAND, by Nicanor Perlas. The Challenge of Artificial



Intelligence. A Spiritual-Scientific Response This book is a synthesis of dozens of lectures on Al from around the world given by the author, in the last three years leading up to its publication in 2018.




LEARN TO CHANGE THE WORLD
